

HEALTH RISKS OF CONTACT LENSES



RISK OF BACTERIAL KERATITIS 1 in 100 contact wearers of 30 years



RISK OF ACANTHAMOEBA



A red, painful eye infection caused by using tap water on your lenses or swimming in fresh water 1 in 1000 contact wearers of 30 years

DO YOU HAVE THESE OTHER RISK FACTORS?

Glaucoma, Keratoconus, Blepharitis, large pupils, thin corneas, dry eyes, or previous refractive surgery.

If you have any of these, please consult your doctor for further analysis.
